Happy Holidays from the Borneo Project! As the year winds to an end, we have been wrapping up programs for the year, and making big plans for next year's work.

The News from Borneo:

Taib's sister ordered to pay restitution to local communities! In an important victory for indigenous rights, Taib's sister, Raziah, was ordered to pay RM 160,000 (just over \$50,000) for her companies involvement in illegal land grabs and pollution of the natural environment in Sarawak. Project Updates:

The end of the year has been a time for reflection, planning, and of course, raising the funds that we need to scale up our work next year. This has been a huge year for the Borneo Project: We have begun work on stopping the 12 new dams planned for Sarawak, started our indigenous language children's book project, and taken on Taib with protests in the streets of Seattle and San Francisco.
